PRAYER LIFE MANUAL

The Lord has been speaking to me about a new dimension of prayer that will usher in a dramatic change to the Body of Christ. This move of intercession and prayer will birth a New Wineskin Church. The Old Wineskin Church was not intimate with God nor could it produce the abundance of fruit that God desires. The key to producing fruit is to be led by God. John 15:5 Most people in the church are not experiencing real intimacy with God and as a result the church has become performance based, meaning they are trying to please man and God through works. God wants us to develop a relationship with Him. This is why He created us. It just makes sense that if there is going to be a dramatic change in the church that prayer and intercession will intensify. We must allow the Lord to change our understanding about the purpose of prayer.

To fully understand God's purpose for prayer we must first establish why did God create man? In Genesis 1, God declares His plan, to make man in His image, but why did He plan to do that? The Bible says God walked with Adam in the Garden, demonstrating God's desire to be in relationship with man. This theme of relationship is again mentioned when God makes man a helper. God's reason for making a helper was that it was not good for man to be alone. I also believe as we learn to be intimate on earth with each other it helps us be intimate with God. All this leads us to infer that God's ultimate purpose is to make man in His image for the purpose of relationship. Accordingly, the purpose of prayer must relate to God's ultimate purpose.

The purpose and theme of prayer has three necessary and sequential aspects: to be formed into God's image, experience intimacy with God and bring God's will into the earth. When we place a priority on being transformed into God's nature and then yield to doing His will we are in God's perfect will and we have set our love upon God. We can claim the promise in Psalm 91:14-15, "because he has set his love upon me therefore I will deliver him and answer his prayer." This is the place of intercession where the Spirit of God brings breakthrough.

We see this theme of God's purpose beginning in the first verses of the Lord's prayer in Matthew 6:6. Jesus taught them what is known as an index model of prayer. Jesus gave His disciples a list of subjects or categories they were to pray.

- 1. <u>Our Father who art in heaven</u> = Calling God Father implies a covenant family relationship that God desires to establish.
- 2. <u>Hallowed be thy name</u> = the name or nature of God is unique and to be desired.
- 3. **Thy kingdom come** = a kingdom is to be established to accomplish God's purpose of bringing His nature to His people.
- 4. Thy will be done on earth = We should see prayer as aligning ourselves with God's will.

All of this shows us the ultimate goal of prayer is to establish a kingdom so all mankind can be transformed into the very nature of God. This will bring the will of God into the earth. Remember the statement that Jesus made to Peter when He asked, "who do you say I am?" Peter responded, "Christ the Messiah," And Jesus declared, "upon this rock I will build my church." He meant that the revelation of God will be the purpose of the Church. The life of Jesus, the Holy Spirit, Prayer and the Word of God are the primary vehicles for this revelation.

Once we establish the true purpose of prayer we can remove one of the key obstacles to hearing God. God's primary reason for speaking to man is not to give guidance but to form his nature and character in us.

If God were to give direction to us in every instance, we would be like robots and our growth would be stunted. This is why we must see that God will speak and direct us in such a way as to cause His nature to be formed in us. Sometimes this means making us wait to see how we will react or if we will persevere.

Once God's nature begins to form, it will provide us with more direction for our lives. This growing nature of God can be called an increased sense of oneness. We will act as our Lord acts because we have His nature. God wants to form a Christ-like character in each of us to give direction. If we seek direction yet refuse to be changed by God we limit the depth of communication. To be in the place of constant change by God is to be in his perfect will and the place of prayer and intercession. Romans 8:28

We see from the word of God that prayer has three practical aspects:

- 1. To know God John 17:3-4, Paslm 46:10
- 2. To know God's will and ways Exodus 33:12-18
- 3. To give God dominion on the earth through man's yielded will Genesis 1:26-27, Romans 6:13-14

The keys to hearing from God is to understand the importance of God's word, His will and nature. The still small voice that God uses to speak to us is a smaller aspect of God's communicative efforts.

We will focus on these three areas by looking at the practical side of these aspects.

- 5. Set aside specific times when you get together with other Christians for prayer and intercession. At least weekly if possible. Developing neighborhood, school and on-the-job prayer groups is one way to do this in addition to your local church groups.
- 6. Stay faithful in prayer until the answer comes. George Mueller prayed 50 years for a man that was saved at his funeral.

LESSON VI - KEEPING A PRAYER JOURNAL GUIDELINES FOR MAINTAINING A PRAYER DIARY

1. **DAILY** enter the main thing you did that day plus any special things that happened especially those of Spiritual significance such as witnessing opportunities and answers to prayer. Write a brief description of people you met, decisions you made, ideas, thoughts, good & bad things that happened, and evaluate what you did. Write down how you could improve, and avoid mistakes.

EXAMPLE: JANUARY 3, 1992

Went to work. Shared Jesus with John whom I've been praying for. Prayed through my prayer list, & received understanding about end times from study of Matthew 24 see study notes). Prayed for special financial need. see prayer Journal)

2. MAKE A PRAYER LIST divided by categories of lost people, church members, political and spiritual leaders, missionaries, and special needs.

EXAMPLE :

LOST CHURCH MEMBERS LEADERS MISSIONARY SPECIAL NEEDS J. Doe Shirley Gayle Pastor (name of Missions Trip Bill S. President Missionary)

- 3. **KEEP A PRAYER JOURNAL** of special request; enter the request, the date it was made, when it was answered, and how it was answered.
- 4. **KEEP A STUDY JOURNAL** of special things God shows you each day as you study His word.

EXAMPLE:

MATTHEW 24

JAN. 3, 92

verse 14 showed me how important it is to share Jesus.

verse 20 & 21 showed me how important prayer is.

verse 44 - 51 showed me how important it is for me to be doing what God has told me to do.

- 5. **Keep a Quiet Time Journal** to help you clarify what God speaks to you during your quiet time. List the following as categories:
 - 1. Date
 - 2. Scripture or Key Verse
 - 3. What God says
 - 4. What your thoughts are
 - 5. What actions you should take or change
 - 6. How you should pray.

SECTION TWO

HOW TO HEAR THE WORD OF THE LORD

Introduction:

- 1. How often each day are we called upon to hear something. Commercials on television, radio are presented that we might hear them and respond favorably. In order to do this successfully, we have to listen and take note of what is being said.
- 2. The Lord calls upon each one to "HEAR."
- 3. In the Old Testament the phrase "Hear the Word of the Lord," appears 36 times. The phrase appears 15 times in the book of Jeremiah.
- 4. The people of God had become exceedingly sinful and Jeremiah, the weeping prophet, calls upon them over and over to "Hear the Word of the Lord."
- 5. They had forgotten Jehovah; adultery was plentiful in their midst; they were continually backsliding; yet, they refused to repent of their sins.
- 6. The basic reason for the condemnation of this people was they "refused to hear God's Word," Jer. 13:10. Thus, God committed them to Babylon.
- 7. In like manner, those who refuse to "hear the word of the Lord," shall be cut off. Acts 3:22-23; 2 Thess. 1:7-9.
- 8. In the days of Jeremiah there were many voices clamoring to be heard: false prophets, priests and wicked kings.
- 9. So today: voices clamoring to be heard: liberalism; false teachers; denominationalism, materialism, etc.
- 10. Thus, God calls upon each one: "HEAR MY VOICE, MY WORD."

Hearing God:

- I. THE TERM "HEAR" HAS MANY DIFFERENT USES:
 - 1. Sometimes it means simply hear a sound.
 - (1) Acts 9:7—They heard the voice (a sound) but did not understand. Often we can hear something and not understand. See Acts 22:9 and Jn. 12:28-29.
 - (2) We hear the truck on the highway, but there is no message.
 - 2. More often it means to understand the message as in Mt. 10:27; Mt. 11:2; Lk 19:47-48.
 - 3. To yield to, to hear and respond, obey such as in Acts 3:22-23.
- II. WHAT IS IT THAT WE ARE TO HEAR?
 - 1. "The Word of the Lord."
 - 2. Jeremiah had a great task, just as we do today. He encouraged the people to hear God's Word, rather than false prophets, and man's words. Jer 23:16-17.
 - 3. Jesus warned of this same problem. Matt. 7:15.

- 4. The apostles confronted the same problem. Col. 2:8. They warned of false teachers. 1 John 4:1; 2 Pet 2:1-
- 5. So, we must hear, obey and teach the "Word of the Lord."
- 6. Acts 17:11 We need the spirit of the Bereans.

III. SOME HINDRANCES TO HEARING THE WORD OF THE LORD:

- A. There are five obstacles to hearing God. (Adapted from "Hearing God" by Dallas Willard)
 - 1. To understand that God's intention is to guide us and communicate with us through many different ways other than His voice. To give emphasis to only a few of these ways is to limit our ability to be guided by God. Proverbs 3:5-6
 - 2. We have the wrong motives for seeking to hear from God. James 4:3
 - 3. Our understanding of God's communication with us is blocked when we misconceive the very nature of our heavenly Father and his intent for us as his children.
 - 4. God must guide us in a way that develops character and spontaneity in us.
 - 5. Failing to obey the direction of God dulls our hearing.
- B. (Though the Word is widely preached, taught, many do not hear And obey it. What are some of the reasons for this?)
 - 1. IGNORANCE:
 - (1) Rom. 10:1-3 -- Jews failed to hear out of ignorance. Acts 3:14-17.
 - (a) It must be understood that ignorance is not God's fault.
 - (b) God gave them the oracles of God, the law and the prophets. Rom. 3:1-2.
 - (c) God gave them the law to bring them to Christ. Gal. 3:24.
 - (d) The prophets bore witness of Christ. Acts 10:43; 26:22-
 - (e) Yet, they rejected the Christ.
 - (2) Man's ignorance today is not God's fault.
 - (a) The word has been preached to all the world. Col. 1:23;
 - (b) All things necessary for man's salvation have been provided. 2 Tim. 3:16-17; Jude 3.
 - (c) It surely is not God's fault if man is lost. Look what He provided. His Son upon the cross.

2. TO PROVE A PRECONCEIVED THEORY:

- (1) Some have a theory to prove and they go to the Bible for evidence. This can cause error in interpretation if one is not careful.
- (2) 2 Thessalonians 2:10-12 -- A lie believe will cause one to be lost.
- (3) Mt. 5:6 -- Must hunger and thirst after righteousness.

3. BECAUSE OF PREJUDICE:

- (1) Religious prejudice closes many ears to Word of God.
- (2) Prejudice, "preconceived judgment or opinion; the making up of one's mind without regarding the facts."

- (3) "My mind is made up! Don't confuse me with the facts."
- (4) Many Biblical examples of prejudice:
 - (a) Naaman -- 2 Kings 5:9-11.
 - (b) Jews who stoned Stephen -- Acts 7:54-59.
 - (c) Jews who heard Paul -- Acts 22:17-23.
- 4. THINKING THERE IS SUFFICIENT TIME TO CHANGE:
 - (1) God's Word warns about waiting until tomorrow -- Proverbs 27:1; James 4:13-14.
 - (2) Let us suppose that you had information that tomorrow would be your last day on the earth. Would you hear God's Word today? Would it make any difference???
 - (3) How do you know that might not be the case.

IV. THOSE WHO REMOVE THESE HINDRANCES WILL HEAR THE WORD OF GOD:

- 1. They hear:
 - (1) That responsible persons who have sinned are under the conviction of the Spirit, unless they hear and obey.
 - (2) That Christ invites men and women to come to Him , Mt . 11:28-30.
 - (3) That God has a plan to Save: Mk. 16:16; Acts 2:38.
 - (4) That God demands an obedient life to be lived. Titus 2:11-12.
 - (5) That one must obey from the heart. Rom. 6:17-18.
 - (6) That the promise of salvation is for the obedient and the faithful. Rev. 2:10.

Conclusion:

- 1. The question that each one must ask is: AM I HEARING THE WORD OF THE LORD?
- 2. Have I sought out what I need to do to be saved?
- 3. Have I removed all hindrances that would cause me to reject any part of God's Word?
- 4. Jehovah is pleading with us to "Hear Ye Him."
- 5. Am I listening? Are you listening????

In the introduction pages of this prayer manual we discussed the key aspects of prayer. The keys to hearing from God are to understand the importance of God's word, His will and nature. The still small voice that God uses to speak to us is a smaller aspect of God's communicative efforts. It is important that we understand that my faith needs not to be in my ability to hear His voice, but in His ability to bring me to where He wants me to be.

Honor God's word

Without a disciplined effort to study and read God's word and then to apply God's word to our lives, we will never hear God speak at the level that is available.

Know God's will

It is more important to know God and His ways then to hear the still small voice. Rarely do we hear the Saints of the Bible pray to "hear" God but to know God and His ways. God uses five ways to make his will known to us. (1) Sovereignty and providence 2)Wise Counsel (3) Word of God (Logos) (4) Inner Witness- peace and the unction of the Holy Spirit. (5) Still small voice (Rhema). To know God and His will is our first priority.

Yield to God's nature forming within you

The process of being formed into the image of Christ is God's ultimate purpose for His people. Romans 8:29 When we cooperate with that process fully we are in God's perfect will. This is the place of intercession because we know sin prevents us from hearing and being close to God. When we see the process of sanctification as an important priority in God's plan for our life then we step into a place of intimacy and protection with God. Psalm 91 & Romans 8:28

God is calling His church out of Babylon. Babylon in scripture is a symbol of the world and religious systems. God is calling us away from the influence of the world and religious systems. He is calling us into a new place of prayer and intercession. If Romans 8:28 is true then when man enters into a place of intimate relationship and cooperation with God the Spirit of God can do greater intercession and travail so that all things work together for good. Notice the context of the passage does not say our "good" but means God's perfect will. Our highest form of prayer is to be submitted, cooperating and yielded to God's will. We are called in Genesis chapter one to take dominion that means to bring the earth under the rule and reign of Christ. We read the Lord's promise to us in Psalm 91:14, "when we set our love upon Him, He will answer us." This is the supernatural place of intercession. This is the new dimension of prayer that God has been preparing for His people.

SECTION THREE

PRAYER AGENGA TO CONSIDER

1. SEEK, SUBMIT, SANCTIFIY

God wants us to seek Him and be changed - He is building us into a type of tabernacle of David. - Acts 15:16 Be in a place of intimacy and intercession and ask that Jeremiah 31:34 be fulfilled in your life.

2. MAKE DISCIPLES

Be a disciple, a true follower of Christ who makes disciples. Discipleship is God's purpose for His disciples. Romans 8:28-29

3. RESTORATION

Pray for restoration and redemption of mankind. Pray for grace, mercy and forgiveness for His church and leaders. Ezekiel 34:7-11

- a. Leaders Pray for those who control and manipulate others and lack humility.
- b. Changed Structure One man control system rather then a ministering body of Christ. Eph. 4:11
- c. Goal is for God's people to be intimate with Him.
- d. It is not about who is right and who is wrong it is about who can demonstrate dominion.

4. PASSION FOR GOD'S PEOPLE

- a. Submit to the right King. Deut. 5:25
- b. We can't change anyone you must embrace death to self

5. LAST DAYS DECEPTION

Understand how to recognize false teachers and prophets. Matt. 7

6. ACCOUNTABILITY NOT CONTROL

Be in fellowship with other believers who are more mature.
